SESSC has partnered with *Seattle Weavers' Guild* and welcomes the entire community to the new weaving studio. Classes are offered during the daytime hours as well as evenings. Drop in studio time can be arranged for a small fee. Check us out. The best deal in town for your weaving desires.

Types of classes offered:

Introduction to Weaving:

Learn how to warp front to back on a loom. Learn some weaving basics.

Macramé:

13th century textile art using knotting rather than knitting or weaving techniques.

Tablet Weaving:

Weaving with threads and a deck of cards. Make beautifully patterned bands to use as jewelry, belts and more.

Bow Loom

Using a simple portable loom to make beaded ribbons.

Kumihimo

An ancient art form that creates patterned cords on a special stand known as the Maru Dai. Weavings can be used as belts and jewelry.

Cardboard Loom Tapestry

Make your own cardboard loom and create a tapestry with your own design.

Other classes might be dying fabrics, back to front warping and other topics as available

All classes are low cost and scholarships are available to those over 50 years of age.
